INFANT JESUS OF PRAGUE SHRINE

Our Lady Queen of Peace is home to a shrine of the Infant Jesus of Prague, a centuries-old Catholic devotion honouring Christ as both child and king. Our statue was brought from Prague by a parishioner and has become a cherished part of our church's identity. In the traditional image, the Infant Jesus raises his right hand in a gesture of blessing while holding an orb and cross in his left, symbols of Christ's kingship over the world. For generations, Catholics have turned to the Infant Jesus in prayer for healing, protection and help in times of need, with many attributing answered prayers and special graces to the devotion. All are warmly invited to spend a few quiet moments in prayer before the shrine.

CWL meets monthly on the 2nd Wednesday after Noon Mass.

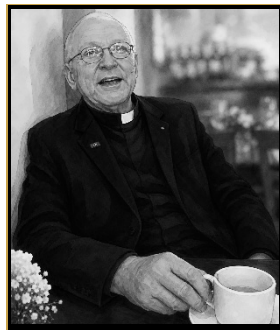

Our Lady Queen of Peace gratefully remembers those who have included the parish in their wills and estates. These gifts can provide long-term support for the ministry and future care of our historic church.

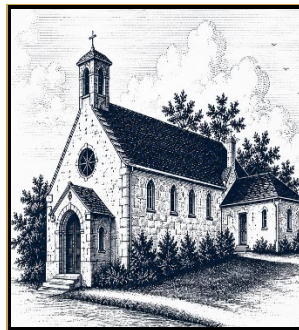


Our Pastor

Rev. Fr. John Domotor has served Our Lady Queen of Peace for many years, bringing to our parish a lifetime of priestly ministry shaped by faith, service and a remarkable personal history. Born in Hungary, Fr. John's ministry has included service as a military chaplain and Senior Fleet Chaplain of the Canadian Fleet Pacific. Today, he continues to serve our parish community through the celebration of Mass, the sacraments and the daily life of our historic church.

Our Church

Our Lady Queen of Peace was built during the Great Depression as a Canadian war memorial dedicated to the nurses, airmen, sailors and soldiers who lost their lives in the First World War. The church was informally opened for divine worship on 24 May 1931, while work on the building was still being completed. Nearly a century later, the church continues to serve as both a place of worship and a lasting memorial to those it was built to honour.

Beloved Catholic Women's Retreat 2026

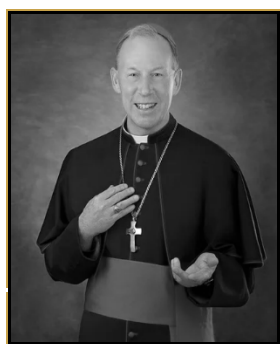

Most Rev. Gary M. Gordon has served as the 17th Bishop of Victoria since 2014. Born in Vancouver and ordained to the priesthood in 1982, he served for many years in parish ministry before becoming Bishop of Whitehorse in 2006. His ministry has included a longstanding relationship with First Nations communities, particularly the Stó:lō Nation, who gave him the name Xyolhmetoxw — "taking care of the people." He was appointed Bishop of Victoria by Pope Francis and installed at St. Andrew's Cathedral on August 28, 2014.

Our Bishop

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Victoria traces its beginnings to July 24, 1846, when the Diocese of Vancouver Island was established with its bishop residing in Victoria. Its original territory was vast, extending beyond Vancouver Island to the British Columbia mainland and Alaska. The See was renamed Victoria in 1904. Today, the Diocese encompasses Vancouver Island, the Gulf Islands and islands off the west coast, serving approximately 94,000 Catholics through its parishes, missions, schools and ministries.

WHAT IS...

A MARIAN MONOGRAM



The intertwined **A and M** form a traditional Marian monogram, commonly understood as *Ave Maria* — “Hail Mary.” Similar monograms have appeared for centuries in Catholic churches, devotional art, medals and sacred objects as signs of devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The crown recalls Mary's queenship, while the fleur-de-lis, long associated with Mary in Christian art, represents purity. For Our Lady Queen of Peace, the crowned monogram has particular significance. During the First World War, Pope Benedict XV called Catholics throughout the world to pray to Mary for peace and, in 1917, directed that the invocation “**Queen of Peace, pray for us**” — *Regina Pacis, ora pro nobis* — be added to the Litany of Loreto, a traditional prayer invoking Mary by many of her titles. More than a century later, that title remains at the heart of our parish and is especially fitting for a church built as a memorial to those who lost their lives in the First World War.
